Women in Bioscience Conference Melissa Cunningham

The 1999 Women in Bioscience conference was held at The Salk Institute on Saturday May 8. Forty-five local and national sponsors helped make this year's conference a huge success. Over 375 people attended the all-day conference that began with an impressive line-up of plenary speakers. We were honored to again have Catherine Didion, executive director of National AWIS, help us open our plenary session with an inspiring speech. Following Catherine Didion were Marlene Haffner, Director of the Office of Orphan Products Development at the FDA; Wendy Johnson, VP of Business Development at Women First Healthcare; and Kim Barrett, Professor at the UCSD School of Medicine.

#### **Conference Overview**

After the motivational plenary session, attendees were able to put their energy to use at interactive workshops. There were a total of 16 workshop sessions. Topics included career development issues, such as "Transitioning from Academia to Industry," "Negotiation Strategies," and "Career Management," as well as information about specific careers in areas ranging from intellectual property law to scientific writing to business development. In addition to these great opportunities, this year's conference included a mini-bookstore and author signing, hosted by Barnes and Noble. Barnes and Noble donated almost \$500 from its sales to AWIS-San Diego.

### **Biannual Networking Event**

The Women in Bioscience conference is a biannual event hosted by AWIS-San Diego and designed to showcase the achievements and positive role models of local women in bioscience. The conference also provides an excellent networking atmosphere and numerous opportunities for career enrichment. This year the plenary session showcased the potential of the AWIS-San Diego scholarship winners with a certificate presentation.

# **Industry Instructors Needed for** Biotechnology Instrumentation Course

"Teaching Opportunities in the San Diego Community Colleges' Biotechnology Programs" David Singer

Recognizing the need for skilled technicians in the bioscience industry, the Center for Applied Competitive Technologies-San Diego (CACT-SD) and San Diego City

College have created a program consisting of chemistry and biology prerequisites culminating in one of two industry-taught courses. These courses provide a real-life perspective and hands-on training for a prospective technician in the Biotech industry.

#### **Description of Lab Courses**

Biotechnology Instrumentation (BIO 206) is offered in the fall and emphasizes training for entry-level positions in research and development. BioProduction Technology (BIO 265) is offered in the spring and emphasizes training for entry-level positions in production and manufacturing. Both are coordinated by Dr. David Singer and use industry instructors.

#### **Instructors Come from Area Biotech Firms**

From 1994 to the present, there have been 56 industry instructors affiliated with BIO 206/265, representing 21 companies. Of these, 28 have been women representing 16 organizations (Advanced Tissue Sciences, Amylin Pharmaceuticals, Arena Pharmaceuticals, Chiron Technologies Center for Gene Therapy, Digital Gene Technologies, Dura Pharmaceuticals, General Atomics, IDEC Pharmaceuticals, Immusol, Molecular Medicine, Mycogen, PharMingen, Signal Pharmaceuticals, Stratagene, Vical Inc., and UCSD).

#### **Teaching Opportunities for Area Scientists**

Each year new instructors from the local bioscience sector have joined the "teacher corps" of BIO 206 and 265. The potential to involve additional personnel has been further increased by staffing of BIO 133 (Applied Biotechnology II), the industry-taught fall course at Miramar College. Sharon Wampler, an AWIS-SD Board member, taught the B206 course last year and noted that this is an opportunity for scientists who have left academia to participate in teaching.

Industry professionals who are interested in participating should have a first-hand perspective of a technician's work and enjoy the prospect of teaching a diverse group. They should also be able to design and teach a protocol that will encompass two to four, four-hour sessions. During these sessions data is collected and analyzed, and time is allotted for a debriefing or summary. Industry instructors also serve as important mentors and role models for biotechnician trainees. For additional instructor requirements and salary information, contact Dr. Singer at 619-450-4631.
