The WIST program is for attendees at all career levels in both academia and industry, and includes fantastic keynote speakers, workshops, roundtable discussions, and speed networking sessions. The speed networking sessions are a great new addition to WIST and are peer-level-specific. AWIS was founded in 1971 by 27 women scientists who got together at a FASEB meeting to discuss the problems of and solutions to gender inequity in the workplace. Since then, AWIS members have made tremendous advancements for women scientists across the nation. One of my favorite achievements was a successful lawsuit brought by AWIS that forced the NIH to include more women on scientific peer review panels. # February Strategy Session: Developing Your Career Success

The February Strategy Session was organized by committee members Grace Nakayama and Margo Streets and featured a guest speaker, Cynthia Ryk, M.Ed. from Valour Solutions, LLC. This session was sponsored by Helicon Therapeutics, Inc.

Nakayama began the session with advice from Marcus Buckingham: greater satisfaction and success are obtained from developing one's strengths (innate talents, acquired skills, and knowledge) rather than trying to improve one's weaknesses. This is because weaknesses deplete energy whereas strengths provide energy to an individual. Ryk utilized the remainder of the session to assist people in discovering their strengths by determining their "brightest" color from Don Lowry's True Colors<sup>TM</sup>. The colors are as follow:

- Blue = Idealist; "people people" who are motivated by harmonious relationships.
- Green = Rational; driven by excellence, expertise, and knowledge.
- Gold = Guardian; motivated by productivity, time, and tasks.
- Orange = Artisan; value freedom, honesty, and people.

After a short personal assessment, Ryk split the room into the four colors and allowed each color to brainstorm on values, strengths, joys, frustrations, and reactions to stress. As the groups began discussing, people within each group easily related to each other's answers. Recognizing similar perspectives in others was a source of encouragement to the participants. The groups then shared with each other, providing valuable insight into other's perspectives. This experiential activity made the session a great success because it provided the participants with an awareness of their strengths, which is their best area to gain success.

Lynne Friedmann, AWIS Fellow, once again offers her popular science writing course through UCSD Extension. This course is an introduction to science journalism with a focus on writing techniques and strategies to help an audience of general readers understand scientific information.
