On March 6th, the fover area of the Frederic de Hoffmann Auditorium at the Salk Institute was transformed into a giant science laboratory. Members of the AWIS -San Diego Outreach Committee (and several other area scientists--17 in all) set up hands-on science demonstrations for 150 San Diego County iunior and senior high school students, their teachers and parents. Activities included extracting and spooling strawberry DNA, carrying out a viral infection under strict biohazard conditions, examining genetically altered mice, sea squirts and yeast, and launching a pressurized air rocket.
