Update on the Upcoming AWIS 25th Anniversary Celebration Plans are quickly coming together for our reception on the evening of Saturday, April 27, 1996 at the San Diego Natural History Museum in Balboa Park, and we hope that you will plan on attending. The February 19th edition of USA Today carried an extensive article on AWIS and its 25 years of accomplishment in the areas of advocacy, mentoring, and leadership training.

The article entitled, "Association Is A Catalyst For Change," contains profiles and observations about the role of women scientists from Noble Laureate Gertrude Elion, National Medal of Science/Technology recipients Vera Rubin and Mildred Dresselhaus, AWIS President Jaleh Daie, and National Academy of Sciences president Bruce Alberts, among others.

FORMER AWIS PRESIDENT NAMED AWIS FELLOW

Pamela Surko, Ph.D., Sector Chief Scientist at Science Applications International Corporation (SAIC) has been named an AWIS Fellow. This is the highest honor bestowed by AWIS and recognizes the significant contributions to science and to the goals of the organization. There are currently only 25 individuals who hold the title AWIS Fellow.

Surko earned her Ph.D. in Physics from the University of California at Berkeley. Her career includes 10 years as a faculty member and high-energy physics experimentalist at Princeton University and eight years at AT&T Bell Laboratories before joining SAIC where she is a senior computer scientist specializing in artificial intelligence.

Surko's numerous honors include SAIC Executive Science and Technology Council member, 1991 Tribute to Women in Industry Honoree from the YWCA San Diego, AT&T Distinguished Member of Technical Staff, and 1986 Woman Scientist of the Year Award from the AWIS Metropolitan New York chapter. Surko was AWIS President from 1984-1986.
