It is KPBS' goal that these projects will help break down students' stereotypes about science and women scientists.


KPBS kicks off S.O.S. in early February at an event held in the station's new broadcast facility on the SDSU campus.

NIST maintains dozens of reference databases of value to scientists and engineers

Catalog of Reference Databases Available

The National Institute of Standards and Technology has announced the availability of its *Standard Reference Data Catalog 1994*. Life and physical scientists will find many of its 92 computerized databases and compilations useful.

One new database, CHETAH, version 7.0, is designed for chemists to predict the performance of substances that they use routinely.

Another, the Solution Kinetics Database, version 2.0, used by environmental scientists, chemists, and pharmacologists for modeling chemical reactions in solution, has been expanded. It now holds data on the rates of 10,800 free radicals derived from more than 14,000 experiments.
