From its founding days, affirmative action has been a fundamental value of AWIS. In the current national debate, the AWIS Executive Board believes it is important to affirm the organization's position on this issue. Therefore, at its June 1995 meeting, the Board passed a formal motion stating that the AWIS stands for affirmative action and equal opportunities. AWIS has already joined with other women- and minority-based coalitions in making a stand for affirmative action.

An 8-member committee has been recruited; representative of the AWIS' geographic distribution.
